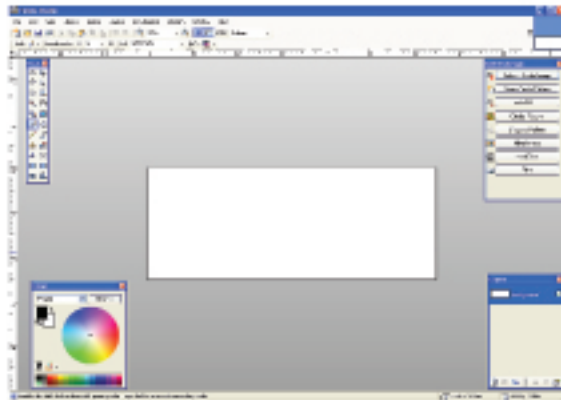
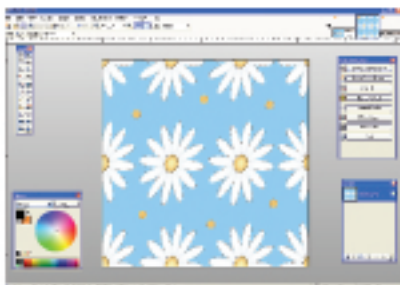


Personalized Luggage Tags



Pick a size for your Luggage Tag. I found great card holders for the tags with a height of 2.5" and width of 6.5".

Go to File/New/Click on Custom. You will now change the Resolution to 300.00, enter 2.5 for your Height and 6.5 for your Width, and click okay. Your new template will appear on your workspace.

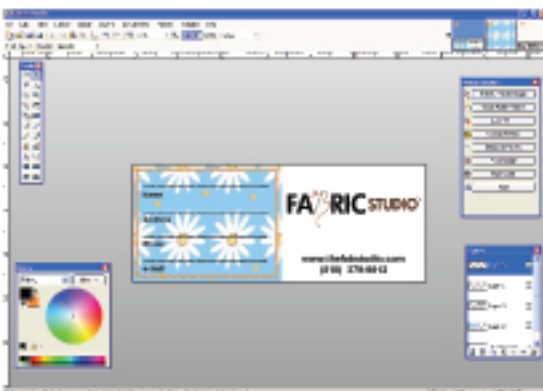


Pick your background image from the Library Images (adjust your color if you want a different color).

Next import your logo if you are going to use one. You can access your logo by choosing Select/Image from your Computer. Make sure that you are bringing in a high

resolution image. You might want to convert your image to a .png file.

You are now ready to construct your Luggage Tag. Add a layer to your new template then click on your background fabric and copy the image. Then go to your new file and paste the image over the left side. The image will not be large enough, so you will need to hold down the shift key, and drag the image (using your mouse) until it covers half the space. Now repeat this process (add new layer) click on logo or artwork and place on the new Template.



Now comes the fun part: Play around with the different design tools and fonts. I picked the Rectangle Tool to draw a box around the flower image. I used the Text Tool (A) to make my dashed lines for information, then typed the information below the lines.

I added my web address and phone number under my logo. Continue adding layers until you are happy

with the results of the project. Save your image as a .png or .jpeg. You can then go to Create a Pattern and bring in your new image (Select/Image/Computer), and print multiple Luggage Tags on one sheet of paper.
