



Printing on Fabric Rolls

Printing on fabric rolls is very similar to printing on fabric sheets. Please refer to **Printing on Fabric Sheets** for the basics, because that information will not be repeated here.

THREADS fabric is wound on the cores with the fabric facing outward.

THREADS fabric rolls come on 3" cores. If your printer is set up to use 2" cores, check to see if you have an adapter or an adjustment that allows you to use 3" cores.

If your printer doesn't have built-in roll handling, it's easiest to first cut a sheet of fabric from the roll that is the length you need. Make the cut as straight and as square as you can. A rotary cutter is easier to use and will cut a straighter line than scissors.

Place the fabric roll in the roll holder. The fabric should come up and over the top of the roll with the fabric side facing up. If the paper side is up, turn the roll around.

Feed the fabric through the printer. If necessary, refer to your printer manual.

The (inside) end of the fabric is taped to the core. When the end of the roll is reached, your printer should sense the tension and stop printing.
